

FTK completed the officiation and handing over of three significant projects on 12<sup>th</sup> October. The ceremony was attended by the TPC Board Chairman, The Company CEO along with his executive delegation, FTK staff, Teachers, and students. The handover ceremony started at TPC Secondary School with the officiation of the library and girl's dormitory which accommodates 72 and 64



Students respectively. On behalf of the FTK team, the FTK manager provided an overview of the projects and emphasized the objectives and expected impacts on the community. The official opening of each project by the board chairman and the company CEO, Mr. Marius Jacobs along with tree planting in front of the dormitory building were successfully done. The handover ceremony continued at TPC's main office for the officiation of the brand-new car purposely for mobile clinic services (Mama bus) to provide essential healthcare service to remote communities. The FTK and TPC's successful completion of the projects are pivotal achievements in their mission to uplift and empower local communities.

TPC and FTK hosted a meeting with the Manyara Council delegation on 9<sup>th</sup> November. The visit aimed to improve relation between TPC/FTK and the community by reviewing and discussing the projects completed by FTK and TPC at Msitu wa Tembo Ward.



During the visit, FTK provided an overview of various projects, highlighting the objectives, impacts, and progress done in Londoto and Kiruani villages. The delegation had the opportunity to see the tangible outcomes achieved in all FTK five sectors. The council members provided valuable feedback and showed interest in the continuation and expansion of these projects. Overall, the

meeting was a positive step toward a stronger partnership focused on long-term goals for community development.









FTK single mothers project has remained committed to its beneficiaries to attain its goal of stimulating business and improving the living conditions of ladies that are single and struggle to take care of their dependants. To achieve this, FTK recently visited 15 single mothers in Londoto village who recently received financial support. The purpose of the visit was to assess the progress made by the beneficiaries and



gather insights on the impact of the support on their livelihoods. Through the visit, each beneficiary was encouraged to share their experience, including successes and challenges. Beneficiaries expressed their gratitude for the support and shared that the assistance has brought positive changes throughout a short period. Generally, the visit confirmed that the financial support has significantly improved the lives of the single mother, boosting their economic activities and enhancing their quality of life.

FTK visited the Mawala Village to meet with the village government, Community Representatives, and Mawala Preschool head teacher on 8th of October. The visits aimed to provide brief FTK updates and progress regarding its projects. The main objective of the meeting with the village government and community was to discuss the ongoing establishment of the rice mill project in the Mawala community and to



explain steps already taken and plans to accomplish. During the meeting, the community got the chance to suggest the amount of 20,000 per household as a community contribution and selected a committee of 9 community representatives, three from each Sub-village tasked to collect the agreed contribution. Additionally, to ensure project sustainability,

the community agreed with the project being undertaken by Mawala Village Council. On the same day, the FTK team met with the Mawala Preschool head teacher to discuss the possibility of modifying the school water pump suggested by the VASAYO company (<a href="https://www.heartsandhandsforhumanity.org/">https://www.heartsandhandsforhumanity.org/</a>) dealing with improving community health through its emphasis on safe water projects. The meeting with the village government and school was highly successful and extended a valuable chance for open communication and collaboration.

FTK team visited Mkalama Village for the scholarship program on 1<sup>st</sup> November. The visit aimed to assess students who applied for a scholarship to understand their financial needs. Eight students applied for scholarship support and five of them were visited. During the assessment, four out of five students enrolled in college despite their financial difficulties, and each student's family indicated a need for financial assistance to cover the tuition fees, accommodation, and stationery to continue their studies smoothly. Also, one student who visited remains at home due to financial

constraints. FTK team will review each student's specific needs to determine appropriate support. The visit to Mkalama Village provided valuable insights into the education needs of the students seeking scholarships. FTK remains committed to supporting deserving students and will work towards addressing the immediate and ongoing needs identified during this visit.
