

About FT Kilimanjaro.

FT Kilimanjaro (FTK) is a non-governmental organization registered in Tanzania. FTK is a joint initiative of the Dutch FEMI Foundation and TPC Company Ltd. We envision flourishing communities in Lower Moshi void of poverty and despair: Communities where all, men and women, young and old, have access to basic health care, education and opportunities to be productive and earn a livelihood for themselves and their families, and to do so in a self-sustaining and environmentally sustainable manner.

Lower Moshi refers to southern part of the Moshi Rural District part of the Kili-manjaro Region in northern Tanzania. The area is south of Moshi Town and dominated by the 16,000 hectare TPC sugar cane estate. An estimated 75,000 people live on and around the estate, spread out over three Wards (Arusha Chini, Mabogini, Kahe) in Moshi Rural District and a small number of villages in adjacent Districts and another Region.

Guided by the concept of an integrated approach to development, with inter- ventions applied simultaneously and across multiple sectors, our work is built around long term goals for four sectors (Education, Health, Income, and Infra- structure) that are interconnected. Using these goals and concrete implemen- tation-related objectives we have explicitly set out to create a framework that is meant to be an invitation to other stakeholders, including the community, lower government authorities and other NGOs, to identify what goals and sec- tors align with their objectives and to consider working collaboratively with FTK toward the accomplishment of a shared vision.













Foreword.

In 2019 FT Kilimanjaro was active in three villages across Lower Moshi and engaged in dozens of different large and small activities in our in- tegrated projects.

Also in 2019 FT Kilimanjaro started operations in the new village Mawalla. During this year a detailed survery was conducted to understand the needs of the village and as well proper introduction of the organization was done through meeting with village leaders and the community at large.

After ten years of hard work, commitment,

determination and dedication the FTK director Mr. Gerbert Rieks had to move back to Netherlands where he will be residing. He will continue to work with FTK and continue to guide the FTK team and the manager in a more coordinating role as an Organisation Advisor and visit quarterly.

Moreover in April 2019 Ruth Ibrahim who was the FTK Deputy Director has tendered her resignation letter due to family reasons. The Board found a very suitable replacement in Nina Sharif who was TPC PR&CSR officer, she will take up the role as FTK Manager.

We hope you enjoy reading a variety of our activities we chose to high-light here in our 2019 annual report. Like other years, we have at-tempted to give you a flavour for the year while communicating the interconnections of our integrated approach to development.

General Information.

In 2019 we received a number of visitors from FEMI and other different organization who funds different projects within our operation areas. Michel, who was here to attend the board meeting on the 20th Sept 2019. Michel also visited some of the projects and specifically the new village where we recently started our operations which is Mawala.

In November we received a donor and their fellow friends who is currently funding Londoto project they visited the projects and witnessed different successful projects that has been done by FTK and community since 2018 in Education sector, Ecology & sustainability, Health, income generation and Infrastructure.

Globewise is one of the Organization which visited us and met with several volunteer teachers who are doing a really good job helping and supporting fellow teachers in schools which have shortage of teachers.

We also had visitors from Munich International School and a group of students from Munich University. They visited Mtakuja project for their field studies and they were all impressed with the project and said they have learned much.







Regional Projects.

FTK Exams

As a way to improve primary school performance especially on national examination for standard seven classes around primary schools in our working area, we introduced FTK exams with all qualities and supervision like national exams so that our students get familiar with big exams. We have a special committee which involves teachers from each school to ensure the quality of exams and supervision. This year we shall do three big exams before the national one. We are so excited with the results

Regional Education Conference

The regional education office managed to coordinate an education conference with the aim of adiscussing challenges and way forwards towards education sector in Kilimanjaro. We had our displaying table with detailed information of what we are doing and achieved so far. The regional office promised to work on our challenges for better results.



The Mamabus program is still continuing visiting the villages that were assigned and the women are enjoying with the services especially Mawala village which do not have the dispensary at all. A nurse from TPC Hospital is dedicated to go out with the Mamabus, she is Veronika and she has recently been trained in Ultrasound to be used in the Mamabus with a mobile ultrasound machine.

Scholarship program

FTK supports the following students at the moment: 17 university, 18 vocational training, 19 college, 4 secondary school and 3 special school, 61 in total. The special school are schools for children with a disability. We decide to focus more on vocational training, college and university education because these have better chance of employment after finishing school.







Tablet program

Teachers requested for tablet training to update their knowledge, they successfully had a training with Peter Unoo from DEAN one of our partners. Student and teachers in both schools are very happy and excited to be using tablets.

Children Centres

The number of kids enrolled in the centres this year are: Kiyungi - boys 39, girls 29; Langasani - boys 32, girls 33; Camp C - boys 22, girls 27; GVK - boys 33 girls 41 and the total is 257. All of the children are already supplied with uniforms and stationaries.

At Kiyungi Children centre 6 new toilet sinks have been installed and they have a new sink outside for kids to clean their hands.GVK classes, toilets and kitchen are freshly painted and new book shelves were provided to them by TPC. Teachers of all centres had training in January to update their Montessori teaching skills.



Road/canals maintenance

Road maintenance of 7km road from Mikocheni kubwa to Mikocheni ndogo via Mawala is now done. We also clean the canals that flow from TPC to Mikocheni to allow the flow of water. This drain is used by the farmers in Mikocheni and it is helpful to the farmers during the dry season to irrigate their farms which are located near the drain. Also a road from Urangini to New Land which is 4km was graded and all the big potholes were filled.









Mama Bus

Officially the Mama bus is now operating under the management of TPC hospital. All logistics of mama bus will be done by TPC hospital. For us FTK, we make sure village managers announce the Mama bus coming to the village and also for HBC's, village leaders and dispensary to have the schedule and corporate.

Community Business Centre (CBC)

Two active entrepreneurs for tomato sauce and bread making will work in the CBC, we are on the final adjustments of the building. We are now waiting for the wiring instalment to finish particularly the three phase electricity and putting an

Education Forum

A big Education meeting was organised by FTK in cooperation with TPC. Participants were heads of schools, academic teachers, chairpersons of schools, District Education officer, District school inspector and ward Education coordinator. The aim of the meeting was to find a way forward to improve academic levels in schools around Lower Moshi. Much has been discussed because there are many challenges. It was agreed that teachers should be committed as well as parents and an investigation is going to be done for those schools which are performing poorly to identify the causes.

Loan Scheme

The loan scheme has been slow in recovering the loaned out funds. The main reason is that most loans are used for agriculture and last seasons were very poor with both droughts and floods. FTK decided to temporarily cease loans and focus on retrieving funds until payback is at an acceptable level. For the month of September a total of Tsh2,870,000 of loan repayments was collected. More is to be collected in October and November since most farmers from Mikocheni and Chemchem are expecting to harvest their crops,

In total During the last quarter, over Tsh 22 million of loan repayments were collected. It could have been more but the unexpected heavy rain during the month of October to December 2019 had affected economic activities in Mikocheni and Chemchem villages due to floods and hence farmer's fields have been seriously affected and that villagers were unable to repay their outstanding loans.

Single mothers







In September 10 single mothers were visited both in Londoto and Chemchem villages. Most of them are doing well. Their business performance was reviewed against their plans and for some a business growth of 15% per month was witnessed. Out of the 10 from both villages 2 single mothers are not doing well, we found out that the money given to them did not meet the intended goal. But the rest are doing well, some have used their profit to buy iron sheets, built houses and others have bought livestock.

In November 2019 we gave support to single mothers. 13 single mothers who were registered since 2017 were given their last business capital. Single mothers who were registered since 2018 were 7 and they got their 2nd business capital while 15 new single mothers from Mawala and Londoto villages have been registered in 2019 were given their first business capital. The total given out is Tzs 13,700,000. In December all single mothers were visited and most of them have promising businesses and we are looking forward to visit and training them frequently.

Sanitary pads

We noticed most of the girls do not attend classes during their menstrual periods. Decision was made to purchase modern reusable sanitary pads for girls. This will allow girls to attend classes all days and improve their confidence and hygiene during their study day. The pads will help them to remain in good health, confidentlyand comfortable to attend class sessions during menstrual cycle. We bought a total of 60 sets of sanitary pads that were distributed to 300 students for both Chemchem and Londoto primary schools.



2019 standard seven results









The results for std seven were out, some of the schools have improved such as Mikocheni primary school and Mawala which is in the New village we started recently. Some didn't like Ronga, Chemchem and Londoto primary schools of which we think the poor results for the two schools Ronga and Chemchem resulted from the challenge of parents and the heads of schools, whereby there was no trust between the two parties, and communication was very poor as well. The government has already relocated new headmasters to the two schools whereby we hope it might bring good changes for the coming New Year.

Pay for success

Pay for success. FT Kilimanjaro did an event with primary school teachers, specifically the schools that are within the "pay for success" programme, which are Mikocheni, Ronga, Chemchem and Londoto primary school. This is done after std 7 results, and rewards teachers for good results. The event was also attended by some government officials who were invited, we had the Ward Education

Officers for Arusha Chini and Londoto, Ward Executive officers both Arusha Chini and Londoto and Division Officers.



Langasani Primary school toilets renovation

Langasani primary school had very poor old toilets whereby some were not even working or in use by the students. Following their request FTK supported to renovate the toilets, they are completed and now in use by the students.









Children Centres

On the 30th November 2019 the children centres were closed for the annual break till 6th January 2020. During this break some of the teachers will be on leave and also during this time we will conduct renovations on toilets and classrooms. On the 30th December we had the usual end-of-year party with the pupils and they were excited for the party and prepared songs, short plays and fashion shows, parents were invited to participate in the party so as to see what their children have been learning for the past one year.

Deworming

In the fourth week of October we conducted the deworming program to primary schools around Lower Moshi. We distributed albendazole tablets in schools of Londoto, Chemchem, Kiyungi, Kiyungi mpya, Mivuleni, Sumaye, Arusha chini, Langasani and all nursery schools. Atotal of 4,788 students received tablets. Due to continuous heavy rains some students couldn't attend at school hence they did not receive these tablets. However, students from Mawala and Londoto villages received their tablets later during the medical camp. Unfortunately due to bad weather and floods, we were unable to reach the Chemchem villages and hence this will be done once the situation improves.



Home Base Care (HBC) training was conducted by two nurses volunteers from The Netherlands, it was about teaching them the important of first aid, and were also able to provide a filled first aid box. The participants were from the all villages we project with, Mikocheni, Londoto, Chemchem and Mawala. We also had some government officials participating like Ward health coordinator for Arusha chini and Kahe Wards as well as our project committee (P.C) All were all impressed with training.







Village Projects

Mtakuja/Mserekia

Mtakuja Development organization (MDO) have had several meetings regarding conflicts between MDO and lands owners, after some few land owners in Mtakuja project wish to claim back their land. MDO reported the issue to the district office whereby the meeting was called, which was a very constructive meeting attend by District Commissioner(DC) and District Administrative Secretary(DAS) and other district experts whereby it was agreed that no land owners in the project allowed to claim back his/her land until further notice from the District Commissioner(DC).

Many Research institutes are interested in the success of the irrigation project in Mtakuja and the MDO. CIAT (International Center for Tropical Agriculture), Ohio University and the Nelson Mandela African Institution for Science and Technology in Arusha are all doing research at the farm. At the same time they help MDO to improve in agriculture and irrigation techniques and also pay for their time.

Mikocheni Village

School lunch program at Mikocheni primary school and Ronga primary school, Parents have reached to

an agreement of contributing school lunch for their children. But they requested FTK to contribute first while parents are continuing collecting contribution. FTK have decided to contribute their portion as per the request and FTK agrees with the school committee that next round they will come with a bank slip that shows the payment for the two terms. The meeting was participated by the: Acting District Executive Director (DED), District Education Officer (DEO), Arusha Chini Councillor, school committee and Parents. Finally it was agreed that parents are permitted to start the contribution. The meeting went very well and it was concluded positively thus the agreement was to start the contribution on February.









The headmaster (John Mbwambo) of Ronga Primary school was demoted and transferred to Kahe ward as a normal teacher, the reason is said that the parents do not trust him. Already a new school headmaster has come.

FTK handed over some equipment requested by the dispensary and school committee, such as a Sunking solar system with five lamp bulbs and a small Radio. The solar was for the Kirungu Doctor's House as well as four tables, four cupboards and four chairs at Ronga Primary school. Staff of Kirungu dispensary were motivated by this.



Livestock committee meetings are ongoing to see the options of improving the herds of livestock keepers. Several meetings still needed to be done and some training so as to educate them about the importance of improving their herds and if possible to reduce the numbers. Due to the climate changes the land can no longer tolerate high numbers of animals.

Community base organization (CBO) still on progresses at Mikocheni village, some few meetings and trainings still need to be done. While the registration is taking place, Mikocheni rough road is repaired and maintained, and is now accessible despite of some challenge of flood destructing the rough roads.

A new market is being constructed at Mikocheni village just near to the cattle dip, this will be



one of the biggest markets in lower Moshi, whereby farmer, fishermen's and pastoralist will be selling their products.

Marketing was a big challenge to Mikocheni community due to the fact that they normally depend on far away markets like Msitu wa Tembo and Uchira Market.







The government have distributed business identity cards for small entrepreneurs that will allow them to do their business without paying the taxes every time, they only have to pay 20,000 a year. It's renewable.

The pharmacy room at the community centre is completed, unfortunately the woman who was supposed to open that pharmacy became seriously sick and within short time passed away. It was so sad because she had already prepared the products to sell and as well she took a short course that would give her a license to be able to operate the pharmacy, The project committee has to look another alternative to have another person.

On 29/04/2019, the government distributed for albendazole tablets and schistosomiasis or bilharzias tablets to Mikocheni and Ronga primary school for the all pupils, this was an order from the government that every child should get such tablets.

Transport for the teachers, especially for those coming from town is still a problem for Mikocheni and Ronga Primary school, but the management of TPC and FTK are working on it to see the possibilities of solving the problem.

A CBO training was held for Mikocheni participants, it was about going through the constitution which is now finally registered. The group is still considering projects to implement, they are opting to start a charcoal making project whereby they will be using waste materials to make charcoal for cooking and supply to lower Moshi.

The registration is already done, soon they will get their certificate of registration. The district representative who's the District Community Development Officer (DCO) advised the group to start as a group of entrepreneurs and it was agreed by the members thus it is now registered as Mikocheni Foundation Group (VICOBA).

A pastoralist meeting was held at Mikocheni village by the ward livestock officer who is new to Mikocheni village. The purpose of the meeting was to educate the importance of vaccination and the effects of eruption of diseases such as anthrax, lungs disease and others. The livestock officer was introduced as well to the pastoralist.









Enaiboishu Women group is doing very well with their bicycle project which is supported by Global Bike organization (https://globalbike.org) in collaboration with FT Kilimanjaro. The women till get some training and assistance through Global Bike staff and now they are doing better. Few weeks ago the office of the District Commissioner (DC) motivated them due to the good work and great effort they showed and they have been recognized as one of the best groups in Lower Moshi, and that led the DC to support them with some cash.

We had a team of visitors from Global Bike, they visited Enaiboishu shop and Nyumba ya Mungu Reservoir. The team were impressed with the women project. Global Bike as well have supported with eye glasses for reading especially for the old people and it was so helpful we managed to distribute to few people by the assistance of the doctor.

We also had a visit from Cre-aid organization which is also one of our partners; they visited Mikocheni especially the project that they have realised such as building Enaiboishu shop which was funded by Global Bike and some houses for individuals built in each sub village.

Mikocheni foundation group is registered and they have started to organize their contributions which will be done once a month and this will help them to get prepared for the project that they were planning to start. The project planned is a charcoal processing industry which will be using waste materials. We made a visit to

TEACA Charcoal burning processing but unfortunately it was the end of the year thus we didn't find the technical person to provide training for the selected members from the group, but they promised us to go back early January.

Londoto Village

Londoto village office received an office cupboard from FTK for safe storing their documents and other requirements for records and safety. Before documents were kept on chairs and floor.

Quarter meeting with project committee team, ward executive, division officer and Londoto village council held to identify new challenges and road map towards implementation of five years' work plan on development project under FTK spirit.

In cooperation with ward and district office (livestock and fisheries department) we organized a one-day training for 120 livestock keepers from Londoto in the village and one- day field visit to livestock Training







Agency-Tengeru Campus(www.lita.go.tz). Among them 48 were women (40%) and men were 72 (60%). The training was facilitated by a veterinary officer from the district.

Netherlands Development Organisation (http://www.snv.org) was introduced in Msitu wa Tembo ward as a new development partner based on training small farmers groups on how to produce quality beans and add value to the product.



The new building for Londoto pre-primary school has been handed over to the government. The guest of honor acting District Executive Director appreciates the good job that has been done by FT Kilimanjaro and the community to improve education quality and learning environment. Community participate by collecting building sand, stone for foundation and man power.

A total of 28 students (11 boys & 17 girls) sat for an interview to seek a scholarship opportunity vocational training for a technical certificate of either electricity, welding, plumbing or mechanics. The demand is very high so we only took

The project committee held a meeting with village council and invited influential people, elders and ward executive office to review the implementation and challenges in quarter one project and the project progress in quarter two.

Londoto is one of the villages affected much by soil erosion which resulted to big gullies in the landscape. We visited onesoil erosion control and agriculture practices project they use terracing to prevent rainfall runoff on sloping land from accumulating serious erosion in Kawawa village (Moshi rural). The project is supervised by a local NGO called land and water development organization . (L.W.D.O) in partner with LIANA Foundation from Finland.



We learnt and adopted some of their local technical and cheap methodologies which can be flexible and adoptable to the community. For the purpose of preventing and reducing land degradation in Londoto village we started a small pilot at the school so students can learn and spread the idea and skills to other places within the village.

To end the shortage of classrooms in Londoto Primary school, local government and FTK decided to realise a final classroom. The school committee and community collected building materials like sand and stones, did site clearing and dug a foundation trench as part of their contribution. FTK hired a contractor to







build a classroom foundation whereby Headmaster and school chairman supervise the whole work on site. FTK emphasises on quality building and future maintenance by the school.

In partnership with more than a drop college (www.morethanadrop.org) two (2) girls from poor family background and less fortunate got a chance of acquiring skills and knowledge in hotel management and hospitality to become self-reliant. Parents contribute only Tsh. 150,000, The course will take 15months and the collage will help the student to get field practice and a job.



We had visitors from Globalwise Organisation (
www.globewise.org). A Dutch N.G.O focusing on Education
to ensure that children and youth people in developing
countries have access to education. They were excited to see
how FTK implements and ensures sustainability in their
education program in Londoto like volunteer teachers, school
lunch program, building and renovating classes and teaching

aids.

After a very long preparation, fundraising and many challenges finally the village council under influence of district (D.M.O) and FTK, an area for building a dispensary has been identified. It has been agreed by the villagers and building materials like sand, stone and site clearance is already done by community. A tender has been announced for local contractors to apply. According to the building committee and the budget available the project will have three

phases. 1st phase trench and concrete foundation, 2nd phase building, 3rd phase finishing, whereby FTK will be involved in the last phase.

This year we experienced infrastructure destruction like roads and culverts and creation of new and expanded gullies due to heavy rain from nearby regions and highland areas (Arusha and Kilimanjaro). This resulted to flooding of Kikuletwa river. The floods also destructed some farmer's crops.

This is farming season in Londoto village most of the farmers are farming in their areas nearby rivers so they can be able to irrigate crops due to scarcity of rain. In this winter season (May to July) most of the farmers are planting beans as a cash crop and other crops like maize, tomato and onion. FTK Agriculture Coordinator have been visiting most of farmers to advise them and remind them on good agriculture practices. This is done through training and exposure to new techniques.







The chairman of Londoto project committee, Amiri S. Mtango, who was representing Serengeti sub-village passed away on July. FTK, the committee and his family lost a very important person who was very active, influential and committed to his work. May his soul rest in peace.

We had a constructive meeting with one of the co-founders and C.E.O of Tatu organization (www.tatuorganization.org) about the possibility of sharing information and partner in similar/related project in Londoto development project. The interesting projects are child rights and protection, water and sanitation, health program and community centre building.



We had CBO training and formation for a week from 26th to 30th August 2019 facilitated by Community Development Officer (CDO) from Simanjiro District council. The training aimed to build capacity and prepare the project committee to become a CBO and take over activities and ensure sustainability of different projects in Londoto village currently and after FTK phases out. the training covered nine (9) topics including the meaning and principle of a

CBO, policy and laws guiding CBO's in Tanzania, roles and organization structure, financial issues, sustainability, registration process and action plan. Training was attended by project committee members, village and sub- village chairpersons, village executive officer, ward executive officer, division officer of Msitu wa Tembo and some community representatives.



A group of counsellors from Simanjiro District (a special committee) visited

Londoto to meet with the leaders and try to find some solutions to community

challenges specifically on the issue of farming land conflict. They also inspected and acknowledge FTK projects and get more explanation from Londoto project Manager on how we

implement and ensure sustainability in our project in

Second season of tree planting on Greening Londoto competition started by providing a total of 1,500 tree seedlings of different types which including shadow trees, pasture trees and few for fruits due to nature of land/soil type and availability of water.









In partnership with Tatu Organisation (www.tatuproject.org) and Pamoja Tunaweza (www.pamojatunaweza.org) we organized a one day medical clinic, the clinic aimed to provide free health service to Londoto families whom majority can't access health care services and afford the check-up and treatment cost. The clinic managed to check-up and treat a total of 280 patients. Also nutrition education was

provided by community health workers (CHW) and home based care providers (HBC).

School and community around who depend the water source (Dorothy's Well) were affected by not having clean and safe water due to a pump breakdown. The only applicable solution for this community is back to use river water for all domestic use including drinking. Different initiative has been taken to resolve the situation. For six weeks TPC has assisted to send water to Londoto primary school by bouzer.



We handed over 48 chairs and 8 tables to Ward Education Officer and school chairman for Londoto pre-primary pupils whom were sitting on the floor.



Every year in august, FTK sends some farmers and livestock keepers to the well- known farmer's exhibition (Nane-Nane) in Arusha. We took farmers from Mikocheni, Chemchem, Mawala and Londoto to learn new skills on farming, new breeds and new innovation on agricultural tools. Farmers and livestock keepers they have been thankful for the opportunity of learning and saw new innovations which are adoptable in their areas.

The community started to improve their pedestrian bridge which will help them to access areas on the other side. Londoto is affected much with big erosion gullies due to flow of water from up-land to low land. The village council through FTK committee have send a request to TPC and FTK for more assistance if possible.

Greening Londoto inspection is on progress, by the change of the year forty (40) household were inspected. We had 80 household contestants but some dropped before the end of inspection. We invited ward executive officer, division officer, clinical officer and volunteers







to do inspections based on health, education, income generation, infrastructure and participation criteria. This means a household can win a total of maximum Tsh 1,000,000 (€400) if this household is best in all sectors.



Project committee under supervision of village leaders did an election in one of sub-villages (Serengeti) to replace two members, one member passed away and other elected to be a political leader (sub-villagechairman). The election was fair and free because members of the project committee were elected openly by the community knowing they are capable of

devoting their time and effort to serve the community.



From 11th to 13th December we had the third local medical camp in Londoto village which involves doctors, nurses, pharmacist, lab-technician, and HBC's from different health institutions in Tanzania. For three days we manage to attend a total of 385 patients; boys 200 (51.9%) and girls 185 (48.05%). We also referred a total of 5 patients to TPC hospital and 3 to referral hospital

K.C.M.C for more check-up.

Nutrition is very important for growth and development of health and wellbeing thus FTK in partnership with Simanjiro district medical officer (DMO) through the district nutrition officer we conducted a training in Londoto village to educate the community. Especially women were taught the importance of nutrition and how it contributes to preventing future illness and improving quality and length of



life. The aim of this training was to respond to the national plan of reducing malnutrition in different ethnical groups within the society. The need was demonstrated during our local medical camp 2018 which showed 65% of kids from 4-10 years are under weight.









With volunteers from Holland we trained nine (9) home based care providers (HBC) on how to prevent and dress bedsore patients and nutrition subjects in general. The training was also attended by the ward health office. First aid kit boxes which contained gloves, hand sanitizer, gauze bandage, scissor, zinc oxide adhesive plaster, sterile, povidone -iodine and a piece of kanga was provided to all HBC.

FTK in partnership with the Government through DMO we understand how worm infections can obstruct child's health. That is why in November we dewormed a total of 205 pupils in Londoto primary school amongst them 102 are boys and 103 are girls. Children in contact with microorganisms are infected easily at the playground or touching pets infected with worms or consuming infected food or water, improper hygiene or inadequate hand washing.



Under the spirit and influence from FTK and village council leaders the foundation of the dispensary has started. The accomplishment of this dispensary will help to reduce the burden of working 6 to 10 km seeking for medical care.

The 2019 standard seven results are out, a total of 15 pupils sat for national exams, amongst them 7 are girls and 8 boys. 2019 result is not good compared to 2017/2018. School committee and school administration in partner with FTK set different strategies to increase performance and attendance in Londoto primary school.

In partnership with LMCC and Milele Animal Health Tanzania Ltd (www.milele.co.tz) we conducted a general meeting with Londoto livestock keepers to explain the importance of veterinary services to improve livestock Health to increase profits for livestock farmers. LMCC & Milele Animal Health also had a chance to advertise their services to the community, which are veterinary services such as vaccinations.



TPC Ltd. have taken pictures with a drone for their annual calendar. Pictures of Londoto Primary school appear in the calendar 2020. In this view one can see the school garden with the drip irrigation very nicely, the building on the left is the kitchen



On October we had unexpected heavy rain that continued up to December. The rain was not expected by most of farmers because it hasn't rained for years in December. But this time heavy rain destructed most of farmers crops like tomatoes, beans, maize and green peppers.









Baseline survey 2017 showed 98% of interviewers mentioned unavailability of safe and clean water as the main challenge in the community. FTK in partnership with Drill2drink from UK started drilling a borehole in Nguzo 800 sub-village to reduce these challenges. Access to clean water is a basic for any social to improve health hygiene and sanitation. We have hit water and the borehole is ready. Now the whole installation has to be done.

Chemchem Village

In January FT Kilimanjaro conducted a training for two days and where 91 participants attended and three professional trainers were there: Dr. Jonas, Dr. Makunganya and Nurse Adonasia Mchumie all from ChemChem Health Centre. We covered the key issues such as: proper diet, nutrients during pregnancy and breastfeeding mothers, danger signs for under five children, HIV exposed infant babies, follow ups and Community HIV prevention.

In February we conducted a medical camp at Chemchem health Centre and at Samanga. We organised a group of Doctors, other volunteers and other supporters such as CCBRT, HBC,



FTK Chemchem committee and community members. On first day our doctors and other experts checked 215 children, the second day checked 108 number of children and last day checked 62 children for treatment and advise. The doctors observe the following diseases; Dermatomes, Ring worms, Malnutrition and Worms's infestations, they also found some children with Anaemia and three with a disability, and they were linked to CCBRT.

FT Kilimanjaro conducted an agricultural training for two days, at TPC Training Centre which had eighteen (18) agriculture Village Committee participants from two villages Chemchem & Mikocheni. The trainer was the Ward agriculture officer, we were very happy to corporate with the local government.







FT Kilimanjaro continues with construction of classrooms which will complete the seven needed classrooms at Chemchem and the renovation of nursery class was done. Also we provided kindergarten class furniture and carpet.

We still put more emphasize on parents contributions for school lunch and the progress is not bad. We have been advised by District Education Officer to add a room at the toilet building especially for girls privacy, and the work was done.



On February 11th 2019, we provided sports and game equipment such as jerseys, whistle, one football, one net ball and three drums which are used for school morning assembles pared and other traditional dances.

FT Kilimanjaro continues with construction of class rooms which will complete the seven needed class rooms at Chemchem and the renovation of nursery class was done. Also we provided kindergarten class furniture and carpet. The construction of a class room which will be used as a Library for pupils on private studies as well as for keeping Books is finished as well and handed over to the school.



Also the school garden fence is already constructed and at the moment teachers and student are in early stages of making sure they prepare the garden for vegetable farming and of course this project will help the school in generating income as well as vegetable for school sustainability.

On June 10th, 2019 FT Kilimanjaro provided school teaching materials to chemchem Primary school and on June 14th, 2019 also FT Kilimanjaro provide twenty six (26) School Desks, one chair and one table for a class teacher and so as to motivate pupils and teachers on learning process.

On July 29th we provided two pairs of jerseys and socks to Chemchem primary school netball team following their request as they are expecting to have the interschool netball challenge with other neighbouring schools.



Leadership training was conducted for Chemchem village leaders and FTK committee with the support of Social workers from the District. The training was for five (5) days and the main areas of training were Good Governance, Rule of law, government Policy and procedures.



On September 23rd we had a meeting and Demo plot (area) visitation with the Agricultural Coordinator. Together with FTK committee we came up with suggestion to restart the Demo plot. The initial stages of Land clearing, primary ploughing and harrowing is done and soon we will start growing maize.







Several meetings with Chemchem Development Organization have been conducted in regards to registration of the committee, this committee is elected from Chemchem villagers and they will be responsible for managing all projects that will be handed-over by FTK after completion of five years of the projects. We started training on how they will care for the different projects with collaboration of village leaders and other advisors in the village as well as outside the village.

Together with Chemchem Development Committee we prepared a new demonstration plot at Samanga street in Chemchem Village. Currently maize has been planted and we had several meetings with Chemchem committee and other



Farmers together with the Agriculture Coordinator of FTK. Discusing the way forward and how we will help farmers at Chemchem to improve on agricultural issues, such as irrigation, suitable soil for farming, fertilizers and good seeds according to the geographical complex area of Chemchem

In December we had two days consecutive training at TPC training Centre for theoretical farming issues such as types of crops, crops rotation, soil improvement or soil erosion prevention, market and marketing of cash crops, and farm record keeping. Also they had one day exposure tour to Mtakuja and the farmers experienced how other farmers succeed but also to discuss challenges by sharing the experience from Mtakuja farmers, the tour was very successful.

In partnership with local partners we are working on sensitisation about children rights to reduce child abuse. It is much awareness raising that we do, little is still known about children rights. Our partner often has international volunteers that assists. We make use of existing government structures and personnel.







Mawala village

We had a meeting with the village councils together with ward representative, the meeting was successful, and it was participated by; the ward Councillor of Kahe, community development officer (C.D.O), Livestock officer, famous elders from the village as advisers and village councils from Mawala, the main agenda was to involve the ward councils about FTK and the project that we do with the community.



The selection of the project committee (P.C.) for Mawala village is on progress. We have already finished with Maasaini sub-village we still have two sub-villages remaining and we hope to finish this exercise soon.

The rough road from Mikocheni to Mawala village which is now done and ready to be used. This rough road was extremely bad especially on the part of Mawala village during rainy season, the community is now enjoying, and the village government with the community has already cleared an area of land whereby there are planning to build the dispensary which the big challenge at Mawala village, they have also poured some materials such as stone and some sand as a starting point.



Mawala Dispensary construction shows good progress, materials and man power is contributed by the community. we are also working closely with village office, Ward office as well, and the district in general, we are getting a closely support with the all leaders as well as Ward counselor (Mh. Diwani kata ya Kahe) and the villagers at large.







The cattledip which was under renovation is already finished, it was a nice project because the government have supported as well as the community. Despite of the all support from the government and the community it was not sufficient and FT Kilimanjaro decided to support the remaining portion and now it is finished. It is waiting to be opened officially and be used by the pastoralists. We anticipate it will reduce the spread of diseases and their cattle will be in a better condition.



FTK organised a meeting with the village leaders to discuss Mawala progress and insist the leaders to be active and cooperative on development issues. The leadership of Mawala seem very committed. The village chairman with his team as well as the ward office including the counsellor are all very responsive and show good signs of cooperation.

The first Mawala Medical Camp was conducted. We managed to check 520Children, five children were given referral to 5 to Kahe hospital and 3 with disability were referred to CCBRT according to the doctor's Recommendation it seems the children of Mawala are more healthy compared to other villages.









Mawala village have already started to benefit with single mother program, whereby 9 women were given s ome amount of money to run their small business that we hope at the end they will be able to support their families.
